



Year 5 Transition Brainbuilder

You must complete at least five of the tasks listed. Try a variety of skills, not just drawing or writing.

1. Design an exciting topic page. Make sure you add colour and draw pictures.
2. Design a coat of arms which tell us what subjects you like, what skills you have and any interesting facts you want to share with us.
3. Create a family tree to tell us about your closest family. Can you find out who your great grandparents were? Where did they come from?
4. Write a letter to your new teacher to tell them some interesting facts about you.
5. Changing Me – Draw the outline of a person. If you don't want to draw a person, just split a sheet of paper in half. On one side, write a list of questions you have about Year 5. Can you find out the answers from anyone or do you need to save the questions for September to ask your new teacher? On the other side, write down some things you were proud of this year.
6. Draw a target board on a piece of paper. In the middle, write your own name. In the second circle, write down things that you are already good at this year. In the next circle, write down anything you would like to get better at. Present your target board in a creative way.
7. Create a comic strip of your favourite moment from Year 4. You could do this on a piece of paper or on the computer if you'd like. You could use real photographs, draw or just write. Challenge: Think about what each event you has chosen taught you. Think about if you would have done anything differently or if you were happy with how the event happened?
8. Using your research skills, find a person you aspire to be like in the future. You can either make a model to show this person and their skills, or your may wish to make a poster, a comic strip, a model or a power point. Think about why this person inspires you and what you like about them.
9. Have a listen to the song "Once I Was In Year One" Do you have any memories that could go in a song like this? Have a go at signing this song and then have a go at making up some verses of your own (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=D9i30MM0J0A>)
10. Think about your time in Y4. Create a top 10 tips list to help the new year 4 children when they return. You could do this as a poster, a presentation, a powerpoint or another creative way.
