# Latest laptop delivery for children from IT company

An IT support company in Dukinfield has supplied much-needed laptops for pupils at an Oldham school to support their learning from home during the current lockdown.

Alexandra Park Junior School in Glodwick is one of the latest schools to have benefitted from the appeal led by ZenTec Network Solutions, after Cerid Grimshaw and business partner Mike Brooks put the call-out to encourage people to donate old technology so it could be refurbished and donated to families who need it.


