
Aims

The national curriculum for art and design aims to ensure that all pupils:

- 1. Produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences
- 2. Become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques
- 3. Evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design
- 4. Know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms.

Implementation





Key stage 2

Pupils are taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Art will be taught in 3 elements:

Element 1: Study of artists and annotation

Element 2: Experimenting with media

Element 3: Creating artwork, modifying and evaluating.


Ongoing assessments take place throughout the year. Teachers use this information to inform future lessons; ensuring children are supported and challenged appropriately. This data is analysed on a termly basis to inform and address any trends or gaps in attainment.

We believe that our Art and Design curriculum lays solid foundations for our pupils to build on as they move in to Key Stage 3.

- book scrutinies
- planning scrutinies
- learning walks
- lesson observations and pop-ins
- staff and pupil voice questionnaires
- data analysis (December and June)
















As part of our Egyptian day we made different types of Egyptian jewellery and cartouches.

Inspired by Nicholas Roerich, we painted our own Mountain landscapes. We developed our techniques in shades of colour and tone.

















We developed our sculpture skills by making tree sprites.
















