Fence Completion

We are very pleased to announce that the fence has now been completed and secured today. The large field behind our school now belongs only to the children (and the birds). Monday is looking the better day for weather next week so please could we ask if parents/carers could send in wellies or old trainers in a carrier bag so that all our children can go onto the field to explore and experience the enormity of the grounds they have to play in. We thank you for your support.



Several measles cases have been confirmed in the West Midlands. Although Oldham does not have any confirmed cases, it is important to send this information as a preventative approach. Children who get measles can be very poorly. The best way for parents/carers to protect their children form measles is the MMR vaccine. Two doses of the MMR vaccine gives lifelong protection and it's never too late to catch up.



MMR is part of the NHS Routine Childhood Immunisation Programme - with one dose offered at one year and another second dose at 3 years 4 months. Parents/carers whose infants missed out, or anyone of any age who has not yet had a vaccine, are urged to come forward. The free MMR vaccine is a safe and effective way of protecting against measles, as well as mumps and rubella.

Measles symptoms include: high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms.

The number of young people catching measles has risen. It's never too late to be vaccinated. You need two doses of MMR one month apart to be fully protected against measles, mumps and rubella.

It's time to make measles a disease of the past.

If you have symptoms of measles, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. STAY AWAY from GP surgeries and A&E departments – you could spread the illness to others.

It's not just a kids' problem

Teenagers, young adults and anyone who has missed their MMR vaccination can get measles.

Symptoms such as:

- high fever
- rash sometimes starting around the ears
- sore red eyes
- cough
- aching and feeling unwell

Remember, if it could be measles – they need to be in an area where they cannot pass the infection to vulnerable patients such as the immunocompromised and pregnant women.
