Let's end HATE

This is Greater Manchester's Hate Crime Awareness Week and as part of this they are encouraging residents to come forward and report incidents they may have been affected by.

Hate crime is an act of violence or hostility that is directed at a person or group because of who they are or what they think they are, and it can come in many different forms such as physical attacks, a threat of attack and verbal abuse or insults.



It is important to know that anyone can be affected by such incidents, so if you have been affected by a hate crime as a victim – or even as a witness – call 999 in an emergency.

In a non-emergency call 101 or go to a nearby police station and report it.

Extra support is available for people who wish not to contact the police or for those who need extra support. This can be accessed at the **Stop Hate Helpline – 0800 138 1625** – a free confidential 24-hour hate crime reporting service, or by visiting one of Oldham's various third-party reporting centres detailed on the council's hate crime webpage.
