Local & Mayoral Elections Thursday 2 May 2024

Important changes to the way residents vote

If a resident can't make it to a polling station, they can appoint someone as a proxy to vote on their behalf. The deadline to apply for a proxy vote is 5pm on Wednesday 24 April 2024. There's a new rule about how many people one person can vote for as a proxy. A resident can only vote for two people now. However, if they're voting for people from the UK who live in other countries, they can vote for up to four people. Out of those four, only two can live in the UK. Voters now need a suitable form of ID to vote at a polling station in person. If they don't have a photo ID, they can apply for a free Voter Certificate. The deadline to apply is **5pm** on **Wednesday 24 April 2024**.

There are also new rules for handling postal votes. Campaigners can't handle certain completed postal votes or their envelopes anymore. Political campaigners can't handle postal votes for other voters unless they're close relatives or someone they take care of regularly. It's now against the law, and it's a criminal offence.

Individual voters can only hand in up to five postal voting packs to the election office, including their own.
