The borough of Oldham is set to take part in the Tour of Britain Women 2024 which will see the world's top female riders and teams go head-to-head across four tough stages of a cycling race.

Greater Manchester plays host to the fourth stage of the race on Sunday 9 June, in what will be the first major international stage race delivered by British Cycling Events.

Residents and businesses are being encouraged to show support of the event and cheer on the cyclists as they cycle through Failsworth, Oldham, Saddleworth and Shaw.

Oldham will be one of the highlights on the National Cycling Centre to Leigh (Wigan) route, with its steep hills, winding roads and picturesque views.
