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Vocabulary - Goldilocks words

Word	Definition
Coast	The land near the shore.
Erosion	The geological process in which earthen materials are worn away and transported by natural forces such as wind or water.
Weathering	The breaking down or dissolving of rocks and minerals on the surface of the Earth.
Deposition	Geological process in which sediments, soil and rocks are added to a landform or landmass.
Transportation	Investigation of movement and connections between people, goods and information.
Headland	A coastal landform, a point of land usually high and often with a sheer drop, that extends into a body of water.

- ❑ Coasts help us understand natural events, such as weather and changing sea levels.
- ❑ Coastal erosion is typically caused by various natural forces. These include ocean waves, wind, rainfall, as well as coastal storms.
- ❑ Crosby Beach is part of the Merseyside coastline north of Liverpool in the Metropolitan Borough of Sefton, England, stretching about 2.5 miles (4.0 km)
