Neolithic	'New Stone age' When humans used 'chipped-stone tools. Just before Bronze age.
Chronological	Time order.
Hunter	A person or animal that hunts.
Stonehenge is a prehistoric monument on Salisbury plain.	Skara Brae is a Stone age settlement in Scotland.

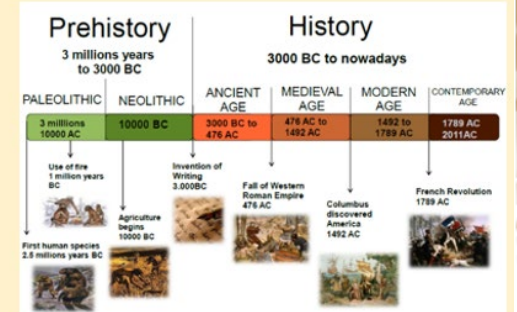
Sticky Knowledge

* I wonder what it was used for?

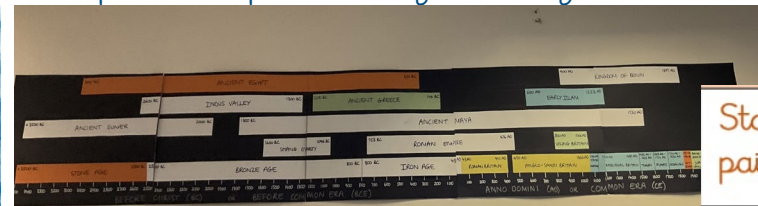
Stone age people, used cave paintings to remember or tell a story.
