

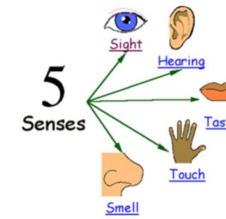
Purpose - What am I writing this for?

### what is a preposition

A **preposition** is a word which describes the relationship between an object and another word, object, or element in the sentence. Let's take a look.

The bird is flying across the sky.



The word across connects the verb fly and the noun the sky. It tells us where the bird flew.


### Simile

Compares two different things.

Something is **like** or **as** something else.

**For example:**

- He was **as** quiet **as** a mouse.
- She swam **like** a fish.




### Metaphor

Compares two different things.

Something **is** something else.

**For example:**

- Ali **is** a walking dictionary.
- Time **is** money.




### What is personification?

The stars **winked** in the night sky.

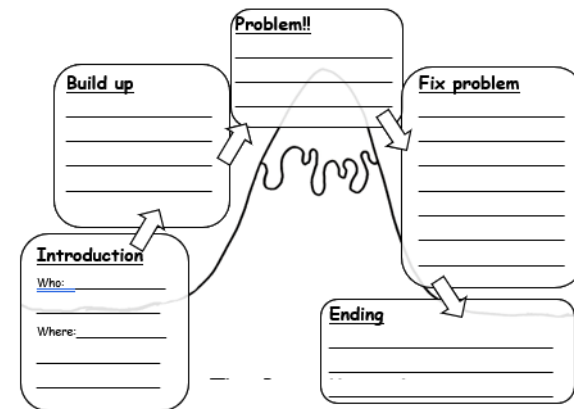
The sun **smiled** happily down at us.
