


## Year 6

	Until 1258, Baghdad was the world centre of culture and learning, with the period being known as the Golden Age of Islam.  Islamic scholars and inventors adopted the Hindi symbol for zero and style of numerals (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, etc.) which we still use today.  By the 8th century Islamic scholars were using paper rather than parchment or papyrus for their writing.  The Golden Age of Islam came to an end in 1258 due to an overpowering attack on the city of Baghdad by the Mongol Empire.
