



Sticky Knowledge	<p>The House of Wisdom housed a library and attracted scholars from around the world who translated texts from the classical world into Arabic.</p> <p>In 762, the newly-founded city of Baghdad became the capital of the Muslim world.</p>		

	<p>Until 1258, Baghdad was the world centre of culture and learning, with the period being known as the Golden Age of Islam.</p> <p>Islamic scholars and inventors adopted the Hindi symbol for zero and style of numerals (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, etc.) which we still use today.</p> <p>By the 8th century Islamic scholars were using paper rather than parchment or papyrus for their writing.</p> <p>The Golden Age of Islam came to an end in 1258 due to an overpowering attack on the city of Baghdad by the Mongol Empire.</p>
